The New Jersey Division on Civil Rights (DCR) is the state agency charged with enforcing New Jersey's civil rights laws, including the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination (LAD), the New Jersey Family Leave Act (NJFLA), and the Fair Chance in Housing Act (FCHA). The mission of DCR is to protect the people of New Jersey from discrimination and bias-based harassment in employment, housing, and public accommodations. DCR publishes fact sheets in 14 different language that provide an overview of your rights and the issues DCR can help you with. If you believe your civil rights have been violated within the last 180 days, please visit DCR's online complaint portal and submit an intake form at the following link: New Jersey Bias Investigation Access System (NJBIAS).
