#### ***Program Summary***

This presentation will focus on the documents that comprise the foundation of basic estate planning and the factors to consider when drafting them. Estate planning involves not only the determination of who will inherit your property after your death, but who will take care of you and your property before your death if you should become incapacitated. Estate planning should also include actions intended to minimize taxes and address issues related to the care and custody of minor children and individuals with special needs.

#### ***Eligibility***
