Overview on Division on Civil Rights

The New Jersey Division on Civil Rights (DCR) is the state agency charged with enforcing New Jersey's civil rights laws, including the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination (LAD), the New Jersey Family Leave Act (NJFLA), and the Fair Chance in Housing Act (FCHA). The mission of DCR is to protect the people of New Jersey from discrimination and bias-based harassment in employment, housing, and places of public accommodations. DCR publishes fact sheets in 14 different language that provide an overview of your rights and the issues DCR may help you with. If you believe your civil rights have been violated within the last 180 days, please visit DCR's online complaint portal and submit an intake form at the following link: New Jersey Bias Investigation Access System (NJBIAS). How to Contact the Division on Civil Rights

In order to file a complaint with DCR, you must first submit an intake form.

You may submit the intake form:

- Online by creating an account and using the NJ Bias Investigation Access System (NJBIAS)
- By calling 1.833.NJDCR4U and asking a DCR receptionist to assist you in filling out the form on the NJ Bias Investigation Access System (NJBIAS)
- NJBIAS is available in English and Spanish. DCR also offers translation services for people
 with limited English proficiency who speak other languages. Call 1.833.NJDCR4U (833653-2748) or email at NJDCR4U@njcivilrights.gov to request assistance with NJBIAS in a
 language other than English or Spanish.
