### **Program Summary**

Microsoft Word combines all font and paragraph formatting into a feature called Styles. Word surreptitiously applies a style to all text in every document (without your knowledge or consent); and the feature cannot be turned off. Since you cannot avoid Styles while using Word, the best defense is to learn about it. Unfortunately, using Word teaches you almost nothing about what Styles is, what it does or how to control it. This program will demystify Styles. The presenter will explain Word's most powerful feature, show students how Styles works, and how to control and customize it. An understanding of Styles will show users how to solve many Word formatting issues that may have frustrated them in the past.
